

### Companies House ID Verification Process


### Step 1 - Creating an account



 Download the GOV.UK One Login App through your App Store.



- Create an account using the same email address that you use for Companies House.
- Select a method for two-factor authentication either text message or authenticator app.



- After completing the sign up, you should end on the 'Welcome' screen (pictured).
- At this stage, you can close the app.


## What a biometric passport is Biometric passports have a small rectangular symbol on the front cover. You can use them to go through electronic gates at airports and international train stations. All UK passports issued after 2006 are biometric. - Once you've clicked 'Verify your identity', you will be required to login to your GOV.UK account (created in Step 1) and your Companies House account.

 Note: You may have created a Companies House account for filing accounts/confirmation statements previously. If not, you can create one.

- Next, you will be asked if you have previously identified yourself – select 'No'.
- You will then be asked a series of questions as shown on the next page.

### Continue to prove your identity

Make sure you have your photo ID with you. You'll be asked to take a photo of it with your phone.





- After you complete the questions (shown above), you will be directed to the GOV.UK app.
- On opening the app, you will be prompted to 'Continue to prove your identify'. You will need to log back into the App.
- · You will be asked which form of ID you are using.
- Select the relevant option from the screen (e.g. driver's licence - as shown in the pictured example).
- You will then be asked to scan the selected ID using the camera on your phone. You will also be required to scan your face to confirm the match.
- Once successfully completed, you will see a confirmation on the app and be asked to return to the GOV.UK website.

### Return to GOV.UK on your computer or tablet

You've successfully submitted your information.

To finish proving your identity, you need to return to the GOV.UK page you left open on your computer or tablet.

### Step 3 - Completing the process

### Find your address Enter your postcode Enter the postcode of your current home address. This must be a UK postcode, for example SW1A 2AA. Find address You will be asked to confirm your most recent address, which will be matched against the relevant ID record.

### Continue to the service you need to use

You've successfully proved your identity. You can now continue to the service you need to use.

Some of the information you shared when you proved your identity might be used to automatically fill in forms within the service.

 Following this, you should see a completion screen.

## Your Companies House personal code is: You can also find your code in the Manage account (opens in new tab) section of your Companies House account.

- Once verification is complete, you will then receive a confirmation with your Companies House personal code.
- This code will be required to match you against relevant Companies House records and for filings in the future.
